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# KEY PROGRAM INSIGHTS

## ADULT SERVICES

We are proud of our services' lasting impact on the people we serve, their families, friends, and the wider community.

In the past year, Excentia Human Services has supported over 500+ people in the local area. Integral to our mission is our workforce of direct support professionals, who comprise 70% of our employees. These employees have contributed more than 3,000 hours of overtime per pay period, showing their dedication to supporting the people we serve despite a shrinking workforce.

Within our adult programming, we have much to celebrate. Our Residential Services operate 36 homes across Lancaster County. This year, 89 people have utilized our Residential Services, receiving in-home support. Additionally, 6% of those people utilize both our Residential and Community Life Services.

Our In-Home and Community Supports program assists people striving for independence within their own homes and communities. In the past year, we have supported over 30 people, including 18 living independently and 22 residing with family.

Similarly, our Community Participation Supports program has engaged 19 people who are actively involved in Lancaster across 17 different locations, enriching their lives and strengthening their ties to our community.

Our Supported Employment Services continues to assist people in their job search efforts. Excentia Human Services collaborates with over 50 business partners through supported employment to ensure job opportunities for those we support. Currently, 25 participants are enrolled, with 19 employed and six actively seeking employment. Our comprehensive approach, including job coaching, assessment, and training, continues to drive success.

Launched in 2016, the TRAIL Academy has been instrumental in guiding individuals toward independent living. With 26 graduates, this 18-month program has proven highly effective in empowering individuals to reach their full potential.

## CHILDREN'S SERVICES

Excentia Human Services offers many services to help children build on the natural learning opportunities they may experience throughout the day, establishing a strong foundation for lifelong success.

We have seen various achievements through our programs and are thrilled with the results. This year, we have impacted 373 infants, toddlers, and children, setting them up for success in the future. In its inaugural year, we have successfully supported five children with our Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) Clinic. We also continue to see strong support and need for our Infant and Toddler Program. Our team of dedicated therapists continue to provide the necessary support in our community through the Infant and Toddler Program.

Kudos also go to the teachers of our four reverse mainstream preschool classrooms, where 84 children are supported in inclusive environments.
