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A Reflection from our CEO

Dear Friends and Supporters,

It's been an exciting year at Excentia Human Services—full of growth, change, and a deepening commitment to our mission: supporting people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and autism (IDD/A) to live full, meaningful lives.

The biggest news? We've expanded into Lebanon County! After thorough market research, our Board of Directors and Senior Leadership Team supported the decision to meet a growing need in that region. Thanks to the strong financial stewardship of our CFO, Sanjiv Nayyar, we were in the right place to invest in this important next chapter.

As with any change, there's discomfort. We know there will be growing pains. But I'm confident in our leadership and our team to make this transition as smooth as possible, always keeping in mind that, at the end of the day, this expansion is about supporting people. And that mission matters now more than ever.

In 2024, the landscape of IDD/A services in Pennsylvania underwent significant changes. Increased state funding has improved access to services and enhanced workforce stability. Nationally, we've seen increased attention to inclusive research, lifelong support, and early intervention. Yet challenges persist—staffing shortages, rising service demands, and the continued need for creative, equitable solutions. These realities make our work not just relevant, but urgent.

In the midst of all this, Excentia is growing stronger. We now operate 43 residential homes and recently expanded into Lebanon County to provide essential housing. Through Pennsylvania's Performance-Based Contracting (PBC), we were proud to earn Select Tier status—a reflection of our commitment to quality and outcomes in our residential services. Our day programs serve nearly 200 individuals across seven counties, and the TRAIL Academy © continues to offer community-based learning experiences. Altogether, we proudly support over 550 people each year.

This year also brought some difficult decisions, like closing our preschool programs within Children's Services. We're deeply grateful to the families, children, and educators who were part of that journey. Moving forward, our focus remains on delivering therapies and early interventions that align with the evolving needs of children in our community. That said, we are excited to announce the expansion of our Children's Services with new clinical sites in Lancaster and Lebanon.

None of this would be possible without our incredible team—over 300 professionals, most of them Direct Support Professionals (DSPs)—whose dedication brings our mission to life every day. Whether it's helping someone gain independence, build connections, or simply feel seen and supported, they are the heart of our organization.

And to our supporters, your belief in what we do makes all of this possible. Your generosity helps us create homes, fund innovative programs, and invest in a future where inclusion is the norm, not the exception. This year alone, our team completed over 11,000 hours of professional development. Fourteen DSPs earned National Alliance for Direct Support Professionals (NADSP) certification, and twenty staff became certified Frontline Supervisors. These achievements reflect our deep commitment to excellence, growth, and person-centered care.

As we continue to grow, one question remains at the core of every decision: What's best for the people we support? It's a question that unites us—staff, donors, families, and partners—in a shared commitment to doing what's right.

I'm incredibly proud of where we're headed and deeply grateful to everyone who's part of the journey. Together, we're building a future where every person we support has access to the personalized, life-affirming opportunities they deserve.

Strategic Plan Overview: Growth, Impact, and Excellence

Our new strategic plan is grounded in a framework designed to strengthen our organizational impact, expand our reach, and ensure long-term sustainability through data-driven performance benchmarks across all departments. By aligning departmental KPIs with overarching goals, we commit to delivering high-quality, person-centered services while enhancing operational efficiency and community engagement.

1. Service Expansion and Operational Performance

Across Residential Services, Children's Services, and Community Life Services, our priority is strategic growth—marked by measurable increases in service intakes, the opening of new program lines and facilities, and expansion into new counties. Each department has defined quarterly and annual performance metrics, including cost reduction strategies, enhanced contracting tiers, and consistent internal audits to ensure accountability and continuous improvement.

2. Enhancing Individual and Family Experience

We are elevating satisfaction by embedding feedback mechanisms across all service lines. Biannual surveys will capture input from individuals and families, with a commitment to act on at least 75% of actionable insights within 90 days. Additionally, each department aims to reduce complaints by 25% within one year, reinforcing a responsive and respectful service environment.

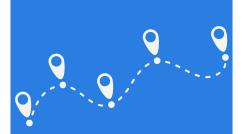
3. Technology and Innovation

Technology integration is a central theme, with regular assessments and rapid implementation of solutions that promote independence, efficiency, and service quality. The Compliance and Operations team is leading a cross-departmental initiative to select and implement an AI-enabled Electronic Health Record (EHR) system within 18 months, supporting streamlined workflows and data integrity.

4. Workforce Development and Retention

Human Resources and the Training Department are collaborating to improve recruitment, employee satisfaction, and skill development. Monthly hiring targets, robust onboarding processes, wellness strategies, and comprehensive training assessments are key components to enhancing staff engagement and reducing turnover.





5. Enhancing Visibility and Engagement for Growth

We are focused on increasing brand visibility, strengthening partnerships, and optimizing campaign effectiveness through targeted lead generation, improved conversion rates, and enhanced community presence. Grant submissions and volunteer engagement will also play a vital role in expanding our funding base and community support.

This strategic plan sets a bold, measurable path forward. Through collaboration, innovation, and accountability, we are positioning ourselves to meet growing demands while delivering exceptional services that uplift the individuals, families, and communities we serve.

Where Support Meets Strength

When you meet Shawn H., you are greeted by a smile that stays with you. It's warm, familiar, and quietly reassuring. There is a serenity about him, a gentle attentiveness that fills the room with calm. Whether he's just finished a workout or is settling into an ordinary weekday afternoon, Shawn is unwaveringly present, observant, and grounded.

"He's very observant," says his sister, Kristy. "He always has been. Even before he spoke, he was watching—always taking everything in."

Raised in Lancaster County, Shawn and Kristy were more than siblings—they were a team. Childhood was a shared adventure, but as adolescence arrived, so did unfamiliar challenges. For Shawn, puberty marked a turning point that would reshape his path toward adulthood.

Kristy remembers the moment reality crystallized. They were in a school parking lot, learning to drive. Kristy was behind the wheel, their father in the backseat, Shawn riding shotgun. At the end of the lesson, Shawn turned and asked, "When's it my turn?"

A simple question, but it landed with the weight of a revelation.

"That's when it hit me," Kristy recalls. "Things weren't going to unfold the same way for Shawn. And we didn't know what that meant yet. But we were going to find out."

There was no roadmap. But there was resolve. "It was never a question of 'Can he?" Kristy says. "It was always, 'What's it gonna take?"

That question became the family's North Star. Through school transitions, the dreaded age-out at 21, and the labyrinth of waitlists, the Houstons kept moving forward. After high school, Shawn returned home for a time. Later, he tried a group home, but the fit wasn't right. Structure is vital for Shawn; without it, life becomes chaotic.

Today, Shawn lives independently—a path that once seemed unlikely, but now feels inevitable. His apartment is more than a place to live; it's a sanctuary. The routines that anchor him are intact. His environment is calm, predictable, and safe.

He does his laundry. He cleans his apartment. He sticks to his schedule. He works out regularly. He loves video games. And, perhaps most of all, he takes pride in his home. It is his, and he knows it

He's also always up for an adventure: a trip to Target, a movie night (Mission: Impossible 8 was a recent favorite), a baseball game, or a beach vacation. There is even Disney World.

Family remains at the center of Shawn's life. His mother visits often; their closeness endures, even as life evolves.

Kristy now sees in Shawn what so many families in their position long for: not just survival, but independence. Not just getting by thriving.

Still, the road ahead is not without obstacles. Employment remains a persistent frustration. "He's capable," Kristy says. "He's so focused. When he's given a task, he follows it through. But the opportunities just aren't there. Too many employers are afraid. Or uninformed."

After our recent Gala where inclusion advocate Randy Lewis addressed a packed house, Excentia Human Services renewed its focus on supported employment. The goal is simple: to match people like Shawn with roles where they can shine. The talent is there. The commitment is there. What's missing is access.

Shawn's support staff know him well. They describe him as intelligent and gentle, someone who finds joy in life's smallest details. A plan is essential to him, and he follows it with remarkable discipline. Disrupt the plan, and it can be tough. But honor it, and he shines.

"There's something beautiful about how much he enjoys what others might overlook," one team member shared. "A trip to a ballgame becomes the highlight of his week. That kind of gratitude is rare."

Shawn is thriving, but it's no accident. His life works because of the synergy between family and support. His routines, his Excentia team, his people.

Kristy knows many families approach outside support with hesitation. She understands the fear—the belief that no one else could care the way a parent or sibling can. But she sees it differently.

"It's not about handing things over," she says. "It's about building something together. Support isn't a sign you failed. It's a sign that you're still fighting for the best life possible."

As a nurse, a mother, and a fierce advocate, Kristy wants more families to feel safe asking that essential question: What will it take?

Because when you ask that, you stop letting fear lead.

Shawn has a rhythm. He has agency. He has people who love him and a place that feels like home.

He is still Shawn. Still calm. Still curious. Still consistent. And with the right support and a family that never stopped believing, he is living a life all his own—whole, dignified, and deeply human.

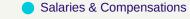
Our Revenue & Expenses

Excentia Human Services earned a 4 out of 4 star rating from Charity Navigator, reflecting strong financial health and accountability.

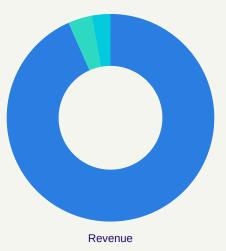


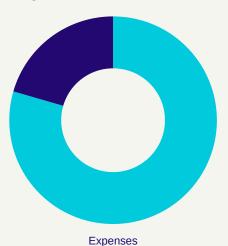

The More You Know

Waiver funding, which is primarily provided through Medicaid, remains the backbone of Excentia Human Services' service model. These Medicaid waivers—administered by the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services—allow individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities to receive essential supports in their homes and communities, rather than in institutional settings. The most significant programs include the Consolidated Waiver, Community Living Waiver, and Person/Family Directed Support (P/FDS) Waiver, each offering different levels of service and flexibility to meet the diverse needs of our community.

Recent state and federal updates have increased funding and expanded eligibility, making these programs accessible to more families and individuals than ever before. There is also a growing emphasis on improving reimbursement rates and quality of care, especially as demand for home and community-based services rises.

For us, this means our ability to deliver medical care, employment support, residential services, and community participation programs is directly tied to the stability and evolution of Medicaid waiver funding. As the state continues to refine these programs and address workforce and access challenges, our mission remains focused on ensuring individuals receive high-quality, person-centered care that supports independence.
